Proposed Changes 2009

Summary of Proposed Changes:

Areas of high or moderate value IF&W waterfowl habitat (shown as a red outline) will be put into the 250 foot Resource Protection District

The Aquifer Protection District was changed to match the most current aquifer data provided by the Maine Geological Survey

The 250 foot Shoreland Zone was extended from the northeast side of Sand Pond up to meet the 250 foot Resource Protection boundary along the outlet of the Pickerel/ Perley Pond complex.

The footprint of the existing gravel pit on Beaver Brook was put into the 250 Shoreland Zone from the 250 foot Resource Protection District

The setback on the impoundment at the western end of Beaver Brook was changed from 250 shoreland zone to 100 foot shoreland zone. Beaver Brook
